FAIRFIELD COUNTY CHORALE PRESENTS: MAGNIFICAT & MAJESTY

Norwalk, CT –The **Fairfield County Chorale** proudly presents *Magnificat & Majesty*, a stirring evening of sacred choral music spanning centuries of artistic devotion. This inspiring program brings together luminous works by *Francesco Durante*, *Camargo Guarnieri*, *Franz Schubert*, and *Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart*, performed by the Fairfield County Chorale and orchestra under the direction of Maestro David Rosenmeyer.

The concert opens with Durante's radiant *Magnificat*, followed by Guarnieri's expressive *Missa Diligite*—a rarely heard 20th-century gem infused with warmth, rhythmic vitality, and Brazilian color. Schubert's vibrant *Magnificat in C* showcases the composer's youthful lyricism, leading to Mozart's triumphant *Coronation Mass*, K. 317, a crowning expression of Classical brilliance and faith.

Featured soloists include **Pascale Beaudin, soprano; Malena Dayen, alto; Luke Norvell, tenor; and Christopher Grundy, baritone.**

With music ranging from Baroque to Classical to modern, *Magnificat & Majesty* reveals the enduring power of sacred choral music to uplift and inspire.

The Norwalk Concert Hall, renowned for its exceptional acoustics and elegant ambiance, serves as the perfect venue for this extraordinary evening. Located at 125 East Avenue, Norwalk, CT, the hall offers a comfortable and immersive concert experience for all music enthusiasts.
